"Return migration after the 2004 enlargement of the European Union: arguments for a reconfiguration of European policies"

at the European Parliament and East-Poland House, Brussels

The project “Re-Turn - Regions benefitting from return migration” has been implemented since 2011 by 12 Re-Turn project partners representing 9 regions from 7 countries (Austria, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Poland and Slovenia). At the workshop project activities, outputs and policy recommendations including a Transnational Strategy for attracting and reintegrating return migrants and capitalizing on their development potential will be presented and discussed. The presented research results challenge the current knowledge and predominant image of return migration in Europe and call for a partial reconfiguration of EU migration policy.
